I worked with Professor Travis Bristol on a research project to understand the school-based experiences of Afro-descendant teachers in Colombia, Brazil, Panama, and Uruguay and with Professor Tina Trujillo in a survey-based investigation to compare and contrast the democratic character of schools in Norway and the Bay Area. I conducted a literature review to construct the theoretical foundation for the projects, obtained Institutional Review Board approval, developed data collection and data analysis tools (survey, recruitment material, consent forms, interview questionnaires, codebook, etc.), recruited participants, interviewed more than 70 participants in three languages, conducted classroom observation internationally, provided mentoring support for two students, and conducted data analysis in the forms of cleaning, translating and coding the qualitative with MAXQDA Software. The projects are in the final stage.
